SEMINAR SITE

The Hawai'i National Great Teachers Seminar is based at Kilauea Military Camp in the Hawai'i Volcanoes National Park located on the Big Island of Hawai'i.

Participants are assigned cozy, rustic cabins that have a fireplace, cable TV, and a small refrigerator. A variety of recreational activities such as bicycling, bowling, tennis, golf, and hiking are available. Participants also have access to a chapel, gift shop, service station, post office, and general store.

DATES AND TIMES

The seminar begins at 5:00 p.m. on Sunday, August 5 and ends at 12 noon on Friday, August 10. To be part of Friday's closing activities, please schedule your departure flight after 2:30 p.m.

REGISTRATION FEE

The registration fee for each participant is \$995 (double occupancy), which includes 5 nights accommodations and all meals. A limited number of single rooms are available for an additional \$300. Fees cannot be refunded after May 4, 2012.

TRAVEL

Participants should fly into the Hilo Airport. The seminar site is a 45-minute drive from the Hilo Airport. Scheduled bus transportation to Kilauea Military Camp is included in the registration fee.

Optional Graduate Credit: For an additional administrative fee, participants can enroll in EDEP 711, Practicum in Educational Psychology, a three credit graduate level course offered through the University of Hawai'i Outreach College by the Department of Educational Psychology. Credit registration is on-site.

ENROLLMENT

Only seminar participants may stay in the cabins and participate in meals and tours.

Enrollment is limited to 60 participants.
