

# Who's Coming?

Community college instructors from across Colorado and from surrounding states of the Rocky Mountain Region. Any educator searching for new instructional ideas and pursuing the ideal of the "Master Teacher" is welcome.

# Why Should You Attend?

To exchange instructional ideas and innovations...to meet stimulating colleagues across disciplines...to talk about teaching with teachers who care about teaching and learning..to build a professional network linking many colleges...to encourage a creative approach to problems in community college teaching...to reflect, relax, and recreate in beautiful surroundings.

#### What Will We Do?

Following the format of the national "Great Teacher Seminars," Rendezvous participants design their own agenda to suit their professional needs. The staff facilitates and coordinates. The agenda often includes panels, organized discussions, "hands-on" mini-workshops, and multiple, small, round-table, break-out sessions, many of which will convene in pleasant niches outdoors. The format will feature choices among activities in which to participate. The exchange of expertise occurs not only in scheduled sessions but also on horseback rides, wilderness hikes, and amidst strolls along the river.

# How Should You Prepare?

Come to the seminar prepared to share with colleagues an innovative/successful teaching technique and a teaching challenge to which you are seeking a better solution. Further, you are asked to bring one especially thought-provoking book or journal article for temporary inclusion in the seminar library. (You may reclaim the book before leaving on Saturday.)

#### When?

Wednesday, October 3 through Saturday, October 6, 2001. The seminar will begin with an informal reception at 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday afternoon; it will close with Brunch on Saturday.

#### Where Will We Be?

Sleepy Cat Guest Ranch is set in the lovely White River Valley 17 miles east of Meeker, Colorado, on the "Buford Road." The ranch is a group of house-keeping cabins (which can accommodate 40 persons in <u>double occupancy rooms</u>) clustered around a log lodge which is also one of the finest restaurants in northwestern Colorado. The White River, a productive trout stream, meanders through the valley just behind the lodge. Within easy reach is pristine Trappers Lake, the rugged South Fork Gorge, and the beautiful valley of Marvine Creekall with trails beckoning the hiker or horseback rider into the Flat Tops Wilderness. Time is set aside to enjoy the inspiring environment.

#### How Do You Reserve a Place?

The registration fee of \$250.00 covers meals, lodging, and all other expenses of the three-day event except transportation to and from Sleepy Cat and pocket money for personal recreation (horseback rides are \$35.00 for a half day). To reserve a place, forward your application form and a personal deposit check of \$60.00 ASAP!

The deposit check will be returned upon receipt of your college check for the full registration fee of \$250.00 by September 14. Because the seminar is likely to oversubscribe (enrollment is limited to a maximum of 40), we urge you to make your reservations immediately.





#### Travel

Sleepy Cat Guest Ranch is easily reached by car. Traveling on I-70, exit at Rifle onto Hwy 13. Proceed north on Hwy 13 through the town of Meeker. Two miles east of Meeker, turn right onto Rio Blanco County Road 8 (The Buford Road). Proceed 17 miles farther east up the White River to Sleepy Cat Guest Ranch on the right. Traveling on Hwy 40, proceed south from Craig on Hwy 13 toward Meeker. Two miles east of Meeker, turn left on Rio Blanco Road 8. Proceed 17 miles up river to Sleepy Cat on the right. Driving time: 1 hour, 30 minutes from Craig; 1 hour, 45 minutes from Glenwood Springs; 5 hours, 30 minutes from Salt Lake City; 4 hours, 30 minutes from Denver; five hours, 30 minutes from Ft. Collins or Colorado Springs.





#### Act Now!

To assure yourself a slot in the Rendezvous, clip off and return the attached Application Form today with your personal deposit check of \$60.00 while you are arranging for your college's full payment of the \$250.00 seminar fee. (Keep a copy of the Application Form for your records; the personal deposit check will be refunded to you in full upon your arrival at the Rendezvous.) If it becomes necessary for you to cancel your registration, the deposit/seminar fee will be refunded up through September 14. Thereafter, an alternate will be accepted from your college or a credit voucher will be issued toward a future gathering of the Rendezvous. Upon receipt of your application, further details about the seminar will be provided.
